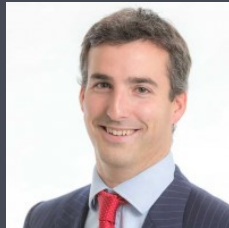
Dr Samuel Antuña

Dr Antuña is the Director of the Shoulder & Elbow Unit at Hospital Universitario La Paz, Madrid, Spain, since 2012, as well as Director of IPHOC (Private Institute for Shoulder and Elbow Surgery) in Madrid since 2009. He is Professor of Orthopaedic Surgery and Traumatology at the Autonomous University of Madrid since 2015 and Associate Editor of the Journal of Shoulder and Elbow Surgery. Dr Antuña is the author of more than one hundred scientific publications in national and international journals, as well as chapters in internationally renowned books on shoulder and elbow surgery.



Mr. Jagwant Singh

Mr Singh undertook his specialist trauma and orthopaedic training on the Royal London rotation. He won the Freeman Prize 2013-14 and was awarded RLHOTS travelling fellowship in 2017 to the Steadman Clinic & US Olympic Institute, Vail Colorado and Harvard Shoulder Unit (Massachusetts General Hospital, Boston). After becoming a Fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons in 2017, he gained a fellowship at the Wrightington Upper limb unit, where he went on to win the John Charnley gold medal in 2018. The British Shoulder and Elbow Society fellowship he gained in 2018, enabled him to add to his expertise at leading North American centres, such as the Mayo Clinic. He also sits on the healthcare delivery committee of the European Shoulder and Elbow Society and was elected to the Society of American Shoulder and Elbow surgeons in 2021.



Mr Oliver Donaldson

Mr Donaldson is a specialist shoulder and elbow surgeon based at Yeovil District Hospital and has been a consultant since 2014. He qualified from the University of Bristol in 2002 and underwent his orthopaedic training in Wales. He completed fellowship training in all aspects of shoulder and elbow surgery at the Liverpool Shoulder Unit. He has an active interest in teaching and research and is a lead author of the national guidelines on the management of traumatic shoulder instability. He has lectured in the UK and Europe on the management of shoulder and elbow conditions.
